### **Acme Oyster House**

724 Iberville St., 522-5973

An old New Orleans favorite dating back to 1910. Menu specialties include oysters on the half shell, Cajun sushi, boiled crawfish and shrimp, and red beans and rice.

### **Basil Leaf Café**

1438 S. Carrollton Ave., 862-9001

Great Thai food at affordable prices located on Carrollton near the Uptown campus.

### **Bayona**

430 Dauphine St., 525-4455

Located in the heart of the French Quarter, featuring Mediterranean, Asian and Indian cuisine.

### **Brigtsen's**

723 Dante St., 861-7610

Modern Louisiana cuisine with a highly imaginative menu. The rabbit tenderloin is a favorite dish in the city. Reservations required.

### **Byblos Lebanese**

A favorite among the city's many excellent Lebanese restaurants.

### **Café Degas**

3127 Esplanade Ave., 945-5635

Charming French Bistro located in a unique part of town, by City Park and the New Orleans Museum of Art.

### **Café Rani**

2917 Magazine St Ste 103, 895-2500

Quaint cafe on Magazine Street's shopping row serves health-conscious meals including salads, sandwiches and vegetarian dishes.

### **Central Grocery**

923 Decatur St., 523-1620

Home of the New Orleans ultimate Italian sandwich, the Muffaletta.

### **Coop's Place**

1109 Decatur St., 525-9053

Good Cajun style eating in the French Quarter, famous for their jambalaya.

**Dante's Kitchen**

736 Dante St., 861-3121

Creative Creole with a local/global twist, in a quaint Riverbend cottage.

**Dick & Jenny's**

4501 Tchoupitoulas, St., 894-9880

Amazing Creole fusion food is served up in this casual, no dress code, no reservation restaurant.

**Drago's**

3232 N Arnoult Road, Metairie, 888-9254

Where legendary charbroiled oysters were first created and where you'll find the best lobsters with the best prices outside of Maine.

**Fiorella's**

45 French Market Pl., 528-9566

At this French Quarter restaurant you will find their renowned fried chicken as well as other New Orleans favorites including red beans and rice, jambalaya, catfish, shrimp, and crawfish.

**Franky & Johnny's**

321 Arabella St., 899-9146

Traditional Louisiana seafood and po'boys in a relaxed casual atmosphere.

**Hanson's Sno-Bliz**

4801 Tchoupitoulas St., 891-9788

This famous snow ball stand has been open for more than 50 years. Folks in New Orleans know summer is on its way when the doors open at this snow cone shop

**Jacques-Imo Café**

824 Oak St., 861-0886

A mandatory University area dining experience. No reservations for fewer than six, so small parties should arrive early.

**Juan's Flying Burrito**

2018 Magazine St., 569-0000

Tex-Mex and burritos in a whole new way. Try the namesake flying burrito--a gargantuan wrap of steak, chicken, shrimp and fixings.

**Lola's**

3312 Esplanade Ave., 488-6946

Said by some to be the best Spanish restaurant in town, famous for their paella.

**Mother's Restaurant**

401 Poydras St., 523-9656

The perfect po'boy is worth the wait at this cafeteria-style deli.

**Mat & Naddie's**

937 Leonidas St., 861-9600

Located in a typical New Orleans uptown home on the banks of the Mississippi River, Mat & Naddie's provides an intimate atmosphere and excellent French and Creole cuisine. Take advantage of the sunset specials and outdoor patio.

**Ninja**

8433 Oak St., 866-1119

This authentic sushi bar turns out beautiful rolls and sashimi for crowds of loyal Tulanians.

**Pho Tau Bay Restaurant**

113 Westbank Expy # C, Gretna, LA, 368-9846

A short drive over the bridge takes you to this West Bank gem. It has hands down the best Vietnamese food –ever-.

**RioMar Restaurant**

800 S. Peters St., 525-3474

Creole, Spanish, Central American fusion!

**Rock-N-Sake Sushi**

823 Fulton St., 581-7253

Located in the Warehouse district this restaurant serves up sushi and other seafood in a casual, fun-filled, musical atmosphere.

**Singha Thai**

413 Carondelet St., 581-2205

A short walk from the downtown campus, this restaurant is known for its good food and friendly atmosphere.

**Tan Dinh**

1705 Lafayette St., Gretna, 361-8008
