Learning objectives:

At the end of the course students will be able to

1. Conceptualize a public health/development project in a domestic or international setting
 - a. Develop a needs assessment methodology and write a persuasive needs statement
 - b. Identify barriers to service including cultural or infrastructural barriers and discuss strategies to overcome them
 - c. Conduct research on potential funders for projects including demonstrating awareness of matching funder guidelines with project design
 - d. Discuss theoretical orientations to types of program designs
2. Develop project goals and design measurable process and impact objectives for projects in domestic or international settings.
 - a. Describe clear and attainable goals for the project
 - b. Discuss various service models
 - c. Design measurable objectives for the project, including process and impact objectives, their differences, and realistic scopes of service
 - d. Develop a project implementation plan
 - e. Design a staffing plan for the project
3. Design programs with effective evaluative components
 - a. Design qualitative and quantitative assessment tools and when to apply them
 - b. Design effective data collection methods
 - c. Draw conclusions on program design and discuss modifications if necessary
4. Develop a feasible, scalable budget and budget narrative
 - a. Design a realistic project budget including personnel, operational, and administrative expenses.
 - b. Design a sustainability plan for the project
