**INHL 653: HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT IN KENYA IN THE AGE OF
HIV/AIDS**

Learning objectives:

At the end of the course students will be able to

1. Identify and describe major socio-demographic, economic, historical, and environmental trends affecting the health and human development situation of HIV/AIDS-affected populations;
2. Describe the HIV/AIDS situation (including regional variations) in East Africa and relationships between HIV/AIDS, health and human development in a range of settings in Sub-Saharan Africa;
3. List and explain major challenges facing local health providers in light of the HIV/AIDS epidemic;
4. Identify, describe and assess relevant program models being used in the prevention and care of HIV/AIDS in eastern Africa;
5. Identify, describe and critique projects and programs to mitigate the impact of HIV/AIDS at the individual, household and community level in eastern Africa;
6. Identify and describe project models and experiences to enhance your own project design, evaluation, and proposal/grant writing
7. Discuss some of the ethical issues of research and development in east Africa in the context of HIV/AIDS.
