The Tulane University School of Public Health & Tropical Medicine seeks qualified and experienced candidates for the combined position of endowed chair in health services research and policy and Chair of the Department of Health Systems Management. The individual selected is expected to provide innovative leadership in funded research, mentor junior faculty, further develop the degree programs, and bring national recognition in health services research to the Department and School.

The Vanselow Chair has been endowed to honor the significant contributions of Neal and Mary Vanselow to health care delivery and policy development. Dr. Vanselow is Chancellor Emeritus of the Tulane University Health Sciences Center and Professor Emeritus at both the School of Medical and the School of Public Health & Tropical Medicine (SPHTM). The Department of Health Systems Management (HSM) is one of seven departments in the SPHTM. As part of the Tulane University Health Sciences Center, the school enjoys reciprocal relationships with other Tulane schools, research centers, and institutes. The HSM Department is widely recognized for the strength of its teaching programs both in the traditional and executive formats, with a strong emphasis on the practitioner/scholar approach to curricula.

HSM degree programs include the MHA, MPH, ScD, PhD, and joint degree programs with the Tulane schools of business, law, and medicine. The Department also offers the MMM (Master of Medical Management) degree exclusively for physicians, both domestically and internationally. Current enrollment is 117 master's students and 50 doctoral students. The Department has benefited from its close ties with Tulane University Hospital and Clinic and HCA, the nation's largest provider of healthcare services.

Applicants for the Vanselow Chair and Chair of the Department of Health Systems Management must possess an earned doctorate in a discipline related to health services research and policy. The successful candidate will have experience initiating and directing teaching and research programs in addition to a distinguished record of research, scholarship, and teaching; sophisticated budgeting skills; a demonstrated track record of obtaining extramural funding; demonstrated ability to work across disciplines and lead collaborative efforts with other departments, schools, and government agencies.

Applications are requested until the position is filled. Electronic submissions are accepted. A complete application consists of a letter addressing the qualifications cited above, a curriculum vita, and the names, and contact information of at least five professional references. The referees will be contacted only after prior notification to the candidates. Other documentation may be requested.
