<p>HSMG 6210  <b>Health Law and Regulation</b></p>	<p>This course is a graduate level course that introduces a wide range of topics in the area of health law and regulation, including a number of relevant statutes. Students learn to recognize potential legal problems in various health care settings, identify the issues and rights that are implicated, and propose solutions or plans of action. They also learn to differentiate between legal problems and problems which can more appropriately be solved in other ways.
