HSMG 7910 Administrative Residency I	<p>HSMG 791 – Administrative Residency I is the summer MHA field experience designed to further expose the future health care manager to the operations environment. The course is a continuation of the administrative practicum in a health care organization. Following the spring residency course, this course consists of 14 weeks of full-time work during the summer semesters. Students are expected to fulfill a minimum of 40 hours per week at the residency site. The student will complete longer-term projects begun during the spring, or begin to assume new responsibilities. Additionally, students will complete a comprehensive administrative residency plan that must be approved by both their preceptor and course instructor. The course instructor also will conduct an on-site visit to each student’s host organization to observe the student’s performance and to review their progress with the preceptor.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Perform as an integral member of a health care leadership team and apply acquired didactic knowledge to operational situations. 2. Generate a practical, in-depth understanding of how one particular health care organization functions, both at the executive and operational levels. 3. Evaluate how health care managers cope with the constraints of time and resources and the need for attention to detail. 4. Review the breadth of factors affecting managerial decision-making and for the political complexity of health care systems. 5. Develop a personal mentoring relationship with a practicing senior manager in a health care organization. 6. Examine and assess the health care industry’s values and the expectations of its leaders.
